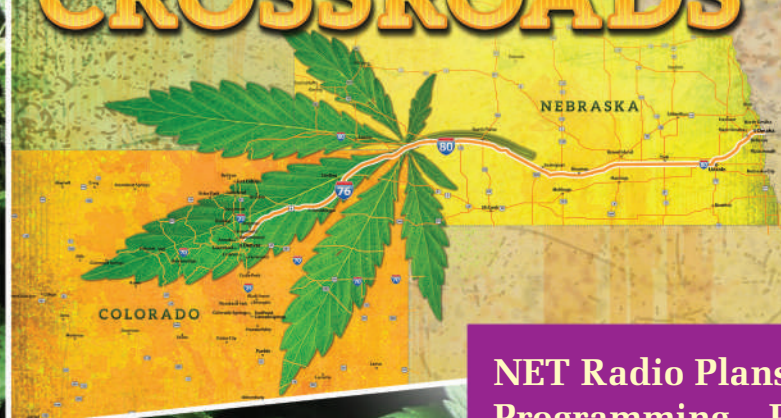

This year I have had the extraordinary privilege of meeting face to face with so many of our wonderful NET members. You said hello and filled the Lied Center for *A Prairie Home Companion* in October and a Celtic Thunder concert, also in October. We saw you at a Celtic Woman concert in June, an Il Divo concert in May, and the Cattlemen's Ball near Paxton in June. And many of you came to special events we hosted in the summer that marked the retirement of long-time general manager Rod Bates. We love that you are not shy about introducing yourselves to us and greeting us as if we are old friends, because in so many ways, we are friends with each of you.

We love these events because we know they reaffirm our relationship with our viewers and listeners. You are curious, interested and active and you want more from us. We promise to deliver on that.

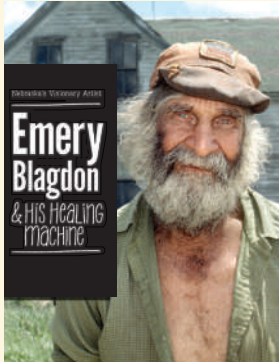

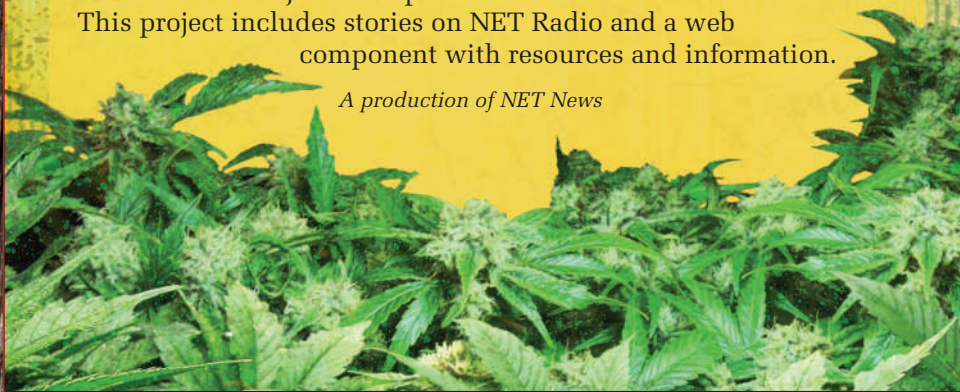

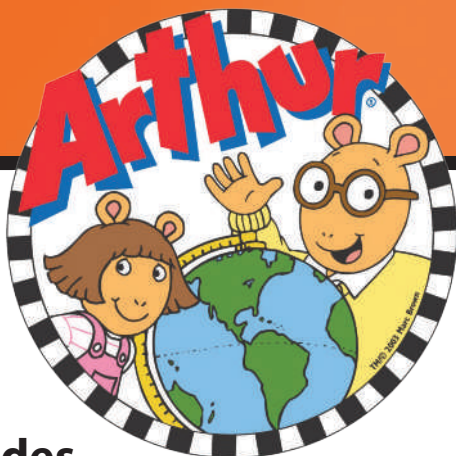

Inspiring Nebraska

When long-time NET supporter Marie E. Nelson died at age 98 in August 2013, it was a natural decision for her family to suggest memorial gifts be made to NET Foundation for Television, NET Foundation for Radio, and two other entities close to Marie's heart. A musician and teacher, Marie Jensen grew up in Chappell, and after marrying Byron Nelson, lived in the Alliance area most of her life, where she taught music in local schools, taught private piano lessons and played piano and organ for churches and other groups.

Marie was a teacher-facilitator for NET Music Appreciation Classes, offered via video tapes, in Alliance. She worked with NET staff and music educators to provide lessons in music history and theory using the tapes. She also used an early NET educational television program on Nebraska history, called *Nebraska Heritage*, hosted by historian Robert Manley, in her one-room schools in rural Alliance.

Her son, Greg, said his parents loved NET Radio and Television and helped develop the statewide networks. Greg's sister, Jann Howard, has worked at NET for 13 years; however, she said, her parents' love of NET Radio and Television long preceded her employment with NET.

"When NET Radio was going statewide for the first time, there was a contest to reach 100 new listeners and a prize for reaching that goal," Greg Nelson said. "My wife and I talked about signing up my parents in Alliance although the transmitter had not gone live yet. At member number 98 I called into the station and got my parents in as members 99 and 100."

Marie served on a citizen's advisory committee that suggested content for public radio and she tried to convince local businesses to play public radio instead of commercial radio.

Greg and Marie visited the "Home Office" of *Car Talk* in Boston. Although

they didn't meet Click and Clack, they toured the office and Marie left Carhenge T-shirts, bumper-stickers and mugs.

Marie and her family loved to travel and they visited England and Europe, and lived for a year in Australia when Byron was a Fulbright exchange teacher. They also hosted a student from Ghana, who has become a second son to the family.

"Anyway, as you might have guessed, our parents were strong supporters of public radio and TV in Nebraska," Greg said. "Our Dad (who died in 1997) loved to listen to and laugh along with (*Car Talk* hosts) Tom and Ray, for example.

"Marie loved to listen to the news and especially to the music. As a piano and organ player, classical keyboard music was very special to her.

She'd listen to the 'Piano Puzzler' on *Performance Today* with Fred Child. I'd call her to see if she'd worked out the Piano Puzzle and she'd have worked out the answers long before I had. She

worked through the *Piano Puzzler* book which we purchased for her one year."

Greg said his parents loved travel, science and nature shows on NET Television, particularly *NOVA*, *Nature* and *Travel with Rick Steves*. Marie especially enjoyed *Mystery!* and *Masterpiece Theatre*. During the final years of Marie's life, Jann often visited her in the evening and they listened to classical music together.

"I think even more than that wonderful content, our mother enjoyed meeting the people who put together public radio and television," Greg said.

On Marie's 90th birthday in 2005, Lora Black played an hour of Marie's favorite tunes on the radio.

"At the conclusion of the program, Marie and Lora spoke via our new cell phone," Greg said. "It was quite a thrill for Marie to have so many friends at NET – it meant a great deal to her, and to us all."

In addition to Greg and Jann, Marie is survived by their spouses, her grandchildren and great grandchildren, and her Ghanaian son and his family.

NET Learning Services Production Wins CINDY Award

An interactive website focusing on career readiness, developed by a team from NET, has won a Silver Award in the annual International Cinema in Industry CINDY competitions. The award was conferred in the category "Website in Education: Guidance, Values, Career Information," in the CINDY Regional (North Central United States) competition.

"Career Readiness" is an interactive website with 11 modules to help users improve basic skills for job readiness. The career development process includes awareness, exploration, preparation, and application of those skills, culminating in life-long career management. The website is available to the public for use and will be highly promoted in high school classrooms and American Job Centers across the state.

This course was created through a collaboration among NET Learning Services, the Nebraska Department of Labor and the Nebraska Department of Education's Career Education System and Adult Basic Education to use distance-learning technologies to reach instructors and adult and youth participants.

Web site teaches history through quilts

A new online educational website created by NET that uses Nebraska quilters and quilts as a way to teach history launched in September.

"Stories of Nebraska Quilters" was developed by Chet Kincaid, a senior producer for Interactive Educational Media for NET Learning Services, in collaboration with the International Quilt Study Center and Museum at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and the Nebraska State Historical Society.

The pilot module, "Grace Snyder: Tiny Stitches, Big Life," features the work of a Sandhills rancher recognized as one of the most accomplished 20th century American quiltmakers.

This module looks at Nebraska ranch life in the first half of the 20th century, women's lives and other aspects of history, told through the work of Snyder's quilts. NET contacted a number of Snyder's descendants for permission to use the quilts in the project.



The original concept for the project and intellectual content came from Patricia Cox Crews, former Quilt Center director. The State Historical Society contributed expertise in historical accuracy and historical photos. Sarah Winans, Kloefkorn Elementary School teacher from Lincoln, helped develop lesson plans for the classroom. NET's Abram Lueders was web master and Lisa Craig designed the graphical look for the site.

Dating from the aftermath of the Spanish-American War, the annual debutante ball in Laredo, Texas, is unlike any other. *Las Marthas* follows two Mexican-American girls carrying this gilded tradition on their young shoulders during a time of economic uncertainty and political tension over immigration.

The Trials of Muhammad Ali covers the famed boxer's toughest bout of all: his battle to overturn the five-year prison sentence he received for refusing U.S. military service. The film explores Ali's exile years when he was banned from boxing and found himself in the crosshairs of conflicts concerning race, religion and wartime dissent.

Medora, April 20



Medora, Ind., is a once-booming community beset by a crippled economy and a dwindling population. This documentary follows the town's down-but-not-out varsity basketball team over a season, capturing the players' stories on and off the court – as the team's struggle to compete parallels the town's fight for survival.

The New Black, May 18



Centering on the historic fight to win marriage equality in Maryland, *The New Black* takes viewers into the pews, the streets and kitchen tables as it looks at how the African American community grapples with the divisive gay rights issue.

Remembered VOICES

Premieres Monday, Nov. 11, at 8 p.m. CT on NET1

History, hope, shared humanity and the healing power of art. These are the lessons Omaha students experience in the new NET Television documentary *Remembered Voices*.

Few moments in history carry more emotion than the Holocaust. And yet, there is a way to look for hope in the destruction. *Remembered Voices* explores how art and culture at the WWII/Nazi-era Terezin concentration camp in Czechoslovakia (now the Czech Republic) teach an important lesson about the human spirit today.

Nearly 75 years after the Holocaust, the documentary follows Omaha students as they first encounter these Terezin voices from the past within an art- and music-infused workshop led by artists, musicians and educators – all partners from Omaha’s Institute for Holocaust Education, the Omaha Symphony and the Terezin Music Foundation. Weaving history and Terezin survivor interviews with these modern day lessons, the documentary forms a compelling look at how voices from the past transform us today.



Remembered Voices includes art created by children at Terezin; the Omaha students relating their life experiences and painting their own images of understanding; the Omaha Public School Remembrance Choir singing a commissioned work that gives meaning to the horror; and the Omaha Symphony Chamber Orchestra and Boston-based Hawthorne String Quartet premiering “Voices,” an orchestral piece inspired by the artists of Terezin.
